

God the Great Giver Week 1 Puppet Skit

(Len and Lucy Introduction)

Len: Hi Lucy, how are you! Can you believe another year of school and Bible club is starting!

Lucy: I know! I'm so excited and this year we are a whole year older so maybe we will understand more and more!

Len: I can't wait to hear the true stories and learn about God with the other Bible club kids!

Lucy: I wonder who all will be there? Maybe (insert some names of kids attending your Bible Club) ----- or ----- or even ----- will be in Bible club this year!

Len: Hey Lucy did you notice moving trucks across the street from our houses yesterday?

Lucy: yeah maybe someone new is moving into the neighborhood. There is so much new right now! Well I think it is time to get to Bible club. Let's go Len it's time for our first true story of the year!

Len: Yes! Let's go!

(Len and Lucy exit)

God the Great Giver Week 2 Puppet Skit

(Grandpa Youall talks about Guidance)

This puppet skit will introduce our new character “Grandpa Youall”. When speaking his part, emphasize the word Youall. Len pops up and pretends to be looking out the window or behind the puppet stage or easel, then quickly pops back down. The teacher comes over and looks in the same direction. Len pops back up still looking in that direction. They continue looking for a few seconds. Len is “spying” on a new neighbor.

Teacher: What are you up to, Len?

Len: I’m trying to see if that man I saw yesterday is still in there. Maybe that’s him looking out of the window!

Teacher: Shall we go across the street and knock on his door and introduce ourselves?

Len: I don’t know about that! I don’t know what he’s like.

(Grandpa Youall comes up looking at the Len and the teacher, who are still looking for him. Then for a few seconds, acts puzzled.)

GY: *(In a booming voice)* Excuse me, are you looking for someone?

(Len jumps and acts embarrassed)

Len: Oh, uh, uh, uh . . .

GY: *(Laughing)* Well, who are Youall looking for?

Len: Well, um, well. I heard someone new just moved into that house and I wanted to know who it is.

GY: Well, glad to meet Youall!

Len: You’re our new neighbor?

GY: Yep! Everyone calls me Grandpa Youall. And what’s your name, young man?

Len: My name is Len and this is Mrs._____. I live in the blue house across the street and my friend, Lucy, lives in the yellow house. I hope you’re not angry that I was spying on you.

GY: No, but who told Youall to spy on me? Whose guidance did Youall take?

Len: Guidance - what do you mean?

GY: Well, guidance - being guided - means being told what to do and how to do it. Youall could have come over and knocked on my door (teacher nods her head as if to say I tried to guide him in that direction) and introduced yourselves instead of trying to spy on me. *(Pause)* By the way, do Youall know who gives the best Guidance? *(Looks at teacher and Bible Club kids)*

Teacher: *(Nods again)* Oh yes, this is Bible Club at name of Bible Club place and this is where I teach all about God's promised guidance and the club members learn how and why they should let God be their guide.

GY: Very good! God promises to give guidance all those who look to Him. It's for Youall. *(Pause)* Hey, why don't Youall come over tomorrow for another visit and I'll have some juice and cookies for Youall? I'll see Youall later. *(Grandpa leaves)*

Len: Well, I guess I need to follow God's guidance when it comes to meeting new neighbors! Hey, Mrs. _____, I think I know why everyone calls him Grandpa Youall!

Teacher: Why?

Len: Didn't you notice? He always says YOUALL when he talks!

Teacher: That's for sure. He says it a lot! See you later, Len! *(Len leaves nodding and saying, "Yeah, a lot." "He sure does." and "Bye")*

**God the Great Giver Week 2 Puppet Skit
(Grandpa Youall talks about Guidance)**

-God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 3
Purpose

(Teacher has a rake and pretends she is raking leaves. She stops when Len comes up.)

Len: Whew! Raking leaves is a LOT of work! Grandpa Youall must have more leaves in his yard than anywhere in the world. I'm sure glad you could help me, Lucy.

Lucy: I'm glad you appreciate me, Len.

Len: I am sick of this work. I wish a giant would come with his vacuum and suck up all these leaves so we wouldn't have to put them all in bags.

Lucy: Better stop complaining, here comes Grandpa Youall. I'll go get the leaf bags. *(Lucy goes down)*

(Grandpa comes up.)

GY: Well, well, well. Youall are quite something!

Len: You must have about 10 million leaves in your yard!

GY: Probably. This is quite a lot of work youall are doing for me. *(Pause.)* Yet, it is not just for me.

Len: Not for you, then WHO?

GY: God says in the Bible that if Christians do something kind for someone they really do it for God.

Len: For God?

GY: God's gift to us is a purpose to do things that sometimes seem like work. When we do things that help others, like raking leaves, it is a purpose for your life.

Len: I hope He doesn't have a purpose for us to rake all the yards in the world!

GY: *(Laughs.)* God knows youall. His purpose for you is just right for you. Worship God and help others - that's God's purpose for our lives and God will help us do that. Watch every day for ideas that God the Holy Spirit, your live - inside friend will give you. Maybe it will be something kind to do or something encouraging to say. Then DO it. I had better let you get back to work. So long youall! *(Grandpa Youall leaves.)*

(Lucy comes up)

Len: Grandpa Youall sure knows a lot about God.

Lucy: If *(Teacher's name)* ever needs a day off, we could ask Grandpa Youall to teach Bible Club.

Len: *(Laughs.)* Good idea, Lucy. Now let's fill those leaf bags!

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 4: Power

Props needed: a large branch for Len to carry. Len and Lucy appear from opposite sides. Len is carrying a big branch that has broken off a tree in a storm the previous day.

Len: Hi, Lucy! Look at this branch I found in my front yard! *(Shows branch)*

Lucy: Wow! Did that fall off your tree last night in the storm?

Len: Yep. And this is only part of it. A huge limb fell out of the tree and landed across our driveway.

Lucy: That sure was a powerful storm, wasn't it?

Len: I'll say. There are tree limbs down everywhere. There's even a whole tree blown over on Maple Street.

Lucy: Can I borrow your branch because I feel like I want to whack my brother.

Len: *(In horror)* LUCY! Why would you say a thing like that?

Lucy: Because all my brother does is tease me about how afraid I was in the storm last night.

(Teacher walks up)

Teacher: Whoa, what did I just hear you say, Lucy? You want to whack your brother?

Lucy: Well, I feel like it.

Len: Mrs. _____, what did you think about the storm last night?

Teacher: It sure was a doozy - all I could think of was how it showed God's power.

Lucy: God's power?!!

Teacher: Sure, remember that God made the earth by His great power. That includes the weather and storms, too. By His power He controls them, too. So you don't have to be afraid in the storms. You can have His power not to be afraid.

Lucy: You mean I can have God's power in me?

Teacher: Yes. God's power is a gift to His children. This power comes from the Holy Spirit and can help you in so many ways - like not being afraid, or to be able to tell others about Jesus, and, young lady, power to forgive your brother and treat him kindly, even when he teases you.

Lucy: Oh, oh. *(Pauses with head bent, then looks at Teacher)* You mean God will give me power to not be mad at my brother?

Len: *(Sarcastically)* That would be a miracle!

Teacher: That's right, Lucy. You can use God's power, not your own, to be kind to your brother when he is not kind to you.

Lucy: Well, I'll give it a try. C'mon, Len, let's go find my brother.

Len: This I gotta' see!

(Len and Lucy leave)

Teacher: *(to audience)* You can use God's power. God is very powerful but He also wants you to have His power to do what's right. He will give it to you when you ask Him in prayer.

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 5: Faith

You will need the visual for the song Faith is Just Believing on the front of the easel and attach the words "Faith is believing without seeing" (included with the lesson) to a pencil that Len will hold later in the skit.

Len and Lucy are walking home from school.

Len: I wonder why Grandpa Youall isn't outside today?

Lucy: Maybe he is sick. Or maybe the ceiling crashed down while he was in bed and he is buried under all the plaster.

Len: Lucy! But maybe I should go check and find out?

Lucy: You'd better. No one else will. I gotta go home and finish my science project. See you tomorrow at the bus stop, Len. *(Lucy goes down)*
(Len knocks on the door/stage. Grandpa Youall comes up.)

GY: Hello, Len. What is this all about?

Len: Lucy and I didn't see you outside so we thought something terrible happened to you!

GY: No, no. I just have to study.

Len: Study? You? I thought you were done with school 100 years ago.

GY: *(Laughs)* I am trying to put a Bible lesson together for the people at the nursing home down the street.

Len: *(Quietly to the Bible Club kids)* I think he is older than those people in the nursing home.

GY: My lesson is on faith. That's what I have to talk about. Faith.

Len: Faith? If you talk about that, the old people will miss their naps. It will take a long time. So just make the lesson short. Real short! FAITH IS BELIEVING WITHOUT SEEING! Just tell them that. I've actually got a sign that Lucy made for me. I think it's somewhere behind the stage! *(Len goes down and comes back with sign in his hand)*

GY: Now, Len, can you explain to me what these words mean?

Len: Hmmmm . . . Well, Lucy told me she has faith every morning that I will be at the bus stop even if she doesn't see me right away. It's like...I SAID I would come so she knows I will. *(Looks down at the song Faith is Just Believing)* Hey, there's a song too. Kids, let's sing it together for Grandpa Youall. *(Len and kids sing the song)*

GY: That is an excellent song! How about youall coming to sing at the nursing home with me next Sunday?

Len: Well, I don't think we have a car big enough for all these kids. But, how about Lucy and me????
That
sounds like a great plan!!!!

GY: Well, youall got my old brain going and now I can finish my lesson. *(He leaves)*

Len: *(Calls after him)* DON'T FORGET TO KEEP IT SHORT!

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 6: Deliverance

You will need to use a small piece of wire bent into an almost-closed C shape to be used for handcuffs. Lucy appears with handcuffs on.

Lucy: Look, Mrs. _____, Len handcuffed me. *(Yells to kids as if in distress.)* Help me, I'm a prisoner!

Teacher: Well it looks to me like you've been playing cops and robbers! Is Len planning to haul you off to jail?? *(Looks at clock or watch.)* Oh, oh, it's five o'clock and I know you've got to go home for supper. I better take those handcuffs off of you.

Lucy: *(Disappointed.)* O.K. but I wanted to play a little longer! Guess I do have to go home. My mom is expecting me and she gets a little upset when I am late. Please help me get these handcuffs off!

Teacher: Let me see . . . now where did Len put the key? *(Teacher pretends to be looking on the ground and all over for it.)*

Lucy: What? You can't find the key!! And we don't know where Len is. How am I supposed to get out of these things? I can't eat like this!

Teacher: Let me think now, how are you going to get you out of this mess? Hmm . . . *(pretends to be thinking)*. No, that won't work . . . No, I don't think I'd better try that . . . Hmm . . . I seem to be stumped! *(stressed)* Now what are we going to do?

Lucy: Aaaaaaggggggghhhhhh! *(Lucy goes behind stage.)*

GY: *(GY comes up...talking to Bible Club kids.)* Oh, hi, kids. *(Talking to teacher)* Mrs. _____ what's all that worrying about?

Teacher: It's about what Len did to Lucy! He put those handcuffs on her and hid the key so she can't get out! And she has to get home or she'll be in trouble! What are we going to do?

GY: Well, now, let me see. *(GY goes behind stage and speaks from there.)* Sometimes if youall just squeeze this kind together a little bit they come apart. There you go. Now you are free. *(GY goes back up nodding his head confidently.)*

Lucy: *(Lucy's voice from behind stage, hollering as if headed home)* Thanks, Grandpa Youall. You really saved me! Bye,bye.

GY: I guess youall could say I "delivered" Lucy from those handcuffs!

Teacher: You could say that, but what do you mean exactly?

GY: *(Laughs.)* Delivered means the same as saved. It's just another way of saying I saved her from something when she couldn't save herself.

Teacher: Well, I'm glad you did because Len obviously wasn't going to deliver her.

GY: Mrs. _____, being "delivered" from those handcuffs reminds me of what God did for the Israelites when He saved them from King Pharaoh. He delivered them from being slaves. It also reminds me of what Jesus did when He died on the cross. He saved us or "delivered" us from our sins.

Teacher: That sure is awesome! And that's what our story is about today. Well, I sure hope Lucy wasn't late for supper.

GY: *(To audience)* You know that youall can have the same deliverance that Jesus gave when He died on the cross. Listen to your teacher tell youall how you can be delivered from your sins.

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 7
Help

Len and Lucy stay down behind the puppet stage (easel). They are trapped in a shed.

Len: *(Loudly.)* Help!

Lucy: *(Again loudly.)* Help! Help!

Len: *(Loudly.)* Is anyone there?

Lucy: *(Loudly.)* Can anyone hear us?

Len: Help . . . !!!

Lucy: We've been stuck in here for a long time. It's no use. We'll never get out of this shed. Why did we ever start playing in here anyway?

Len: I guess we didn't know we'd get locked in. I'm going to get us out of here. Don't you worry!!

Len: *(Really loud)* Help . . . !!!

Len: Hey, remember that Bible verse we learned in Bible Club, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble?" Well, we are in trouble now. Maybe we'd better pray. Let's ask God to send someone to help us get out of here!

Both: Dear God, would you please send someone to help us get out of this shed? Amen.

Len: I'm going to call for help again. Help . . . !!!

(Grandpa Youall comes up, talking to himself.)

GY: Over here, I think. This is where I heard the voices calling. *(GY reaches down and pretends to open door and shouts down to Len and Lucy)* Yep, here you are! Youall can come out of there! Now hurry on home. Your mother will be wondering where you could possibly be!!!

Len: *(hollers from behind the stage)* Thank you Grandpa Youall!! We prayed for God to help us.

Teacher: *(comes up to stage)* Oh, Grandpa Youall. Thank you for helping Len and Lucy! They are so glad to be out of there. Thank you! But how did you ever find them??

GY: I was walking home from the store when I heard someone calling for help. I figured I'd better see what was going on.

Teacher: Grandpa Youall, God sent you to answer their prayer.

GY: He sure did.

GY: *(Talking to audience)* It's important that youall remember to pray. God is ready and willing to help youall when you pray, just like he helped Len and Lucy.

Teacher: *(Looking off in the distance behind the stage)* Well, they're probably home by now. Thanks again, Grandpa Youall.

GY: I hope they remember to thank God, too. After all, He's the One who answered their prayer. Maybe I'll remind them the next time I see them. *(To the audience.)* And I hope youall remember to ask God for help when you need it and thank Him when He answers your prayers. So long, kids. *(Grandpa Youall leaves.)*

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 8: Thankful Hearts

Note: Be prepared to change voices for the mother toward the end of the skit.

Lucy comes up.

Teacher: Sure is strange around here without Grandpa Youall!

Lucy: My mom called the hospital and they said he is coming home today. I wish I could have gone to see him in the hospital. I could have taken my bike. But the hospital is 15 miles away and it gets dark right after school now.

Teacher: Oh, Lucy, you exaggerate.

Lucy: Well, I hate how it gets dark so early this time of year. It takes away our fun.

Teacher: Lucy, here comes Grandpa Youall in his friend's car right now. *(Grandpa Youall comes up.)*

Teacher: *(hugging him gently.)* Oh, Grandpa Youall, we're so happy you are back!

GY: I know. I am so glad to be back home! And I do have a thankful heart. Thank youall for praying for me. God is good. *(Grandpa Youall starts to leave.)* Youall come and see me soon!

Teacher: We will. *(Grandpa leaves.)* Wow! *(Looking at Bible Club kids)* Grandpa Youall has a thankful heart, even in this hard time.

Lucy: God's children have a secret. They find good in everything.

Teacher: What do you mean, GOOD IN EVERYTHING?

Lucy: Well, it's sort of like kicking complaining out and having a thankful heart instead.

Teacher: Wow! Every once in a while you have good ideas, Lucy.

Lucy: Thank you Mrs. _____! Let's try it.

Teacher: Try what?

Lucy: Let's try kicking complaining out about the early darkness and turn it into thanking.

Teacher: O.K. Let's brainstorm. You start.

(Do this next part fast.)

Lucy: We don't have to rake leaves, it is too dark.

Teacher: We can do crafts instead.

Lucy: We can read a book.

Teacher: We can . . . *(Voice of mother interrupts.)*

Voice of mother: LUCY!

Lucy: Whoops, I forgot, I am supposed to peel potatoes for dinner. See ya later. *(Lucy exits.)*

Teacher: I HATE peeling potatoes. I wish my kids wouldn't always expect me to do all the work. Oops! There I go again, complaining!! I've got to keep thinking *(point at head as if thinking then put your hand over your heart.)*...thankful heart, thankful heart, thankful heart!

God the Giver Puppet Skit -Week 9-Rules

Teacher sets some dice, a couple game pieces, and a piece of cardboard made to look like a board game on the easel shelf. Lucy comes up.

Teacher: Hi, Lucy. Want to play my new game - Big Money? I just bought it at a garage sale!

Lucy: Sure! Sounds like fun. How do you play?

Teacher: Hmm. I don't know. We'll have to read the rules. *(Looks around)* Hmm. Someone must have lost them. I don't see any instructions or game rules. . . Oh, well, we can play anyway.

Lucy: I get the car piece. I'm first. Since I can't reach will you roll for me? *(Teacher rolls dice.)* Look, I got a "7."

Teacher: I'll take the shoe piece. Look, I got 2 sixes. I'm moving 12 spaces. That's doubles so I get another turn.

Lucy: Hey! That's not fair. There are no rules about doubles. Roll for me again! *(Teacher rolls dice for Lucy)* I got a "5."

Teacher: *(Teacher moves piece for Lucy)* 1-2-3-4-5. *(Teacher knocks her own piece off with Lucy's piece)*

Lucy: Ha! I'm knocking you off my space. Now you have to go to jail!!!

Teacher: That's not what happens. If you won't play fair, I'm not going to play this game with you. *(Turns game board upside down)*

Lucy: I'm tired of this game anyway. *(Lucy goes behind stage)*

(Grandpa Youall comes up)

GY: What's going on with youall?

Teacher: We were playing this new game I just got called Big Money. It didn't come with any rules. So we tried to play without the rules. It just didn't work.

GY: Rules are important. Playing a game with no rules would be almost as hard as living in a world without rules. People would cheat and hurt one another, and everyone would end up fighting.

Teacher: Yes, that sounds familiar.

GY: Long ago God gave His people rules to live by. These rules would help them treat each other fairly and live in peace. The rules would help people show their love for God. I'm sure youall know what these rules were called.

Teacher: *(Speaking to Bible Club kids)* Do you know?? Shout it out if you know. *(Wait for kids to respond)* The Ten Commandments! That's right, the Ten Commandments!!

GY: Right! And they still help people live today. If everyone would follow God's 10 Commandments, we'd have a wonderful, loving world! Now, youall better come over to my house. I think my own children used to have that same game. I just might be able to find it and give youall those rules.

Teacher: That would be great! *(Pretending to shout at Lucy behind the stage)* Maybe then we will enjoy playing the game more, right Lucy?

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 10-God in Me

Len and Lucy are walking along from left to right.

Len: I hope Grandpa Youall will be home. I need help with this science project.

Lucy: *(Hums Joy to the World song.)*

Len: You have been humming that song ALL DAY! I even heard you during the math test.

Lucy: You did?

Len: I peeked in your classroom and I saw all the kids looking at you. It's kind of weird when you do that.

Lucy: Sometimes I feel so happy that songs just pop out. *(Hums Joy to the World again.)*

Len: Well you might try at least picking a different song for awhile.

Lucy: I can't. It is stuck in my brain. Do you ever have that?

Len: I don't think so. Here's Grandpa Youall's house. See ya later Lucy! *(Lucy goes down.)*

GY: *(Comes up)* Well, well, how are youall? I was just going to sit down and have a cup of hot chocolate. Youall want to join me?

Len: Well, Lucy is headed home, but I'll join you for sure. *(Len hums Joy to the World.)* OH NO! Lucy's been humming this song all day and now I've got the same song STUCK in my BRAIN.

GY: I know how that is!

Len: You do?

GY: Yes, I have some WORDS stuck in my brain. GOD IN ME, GOD IN ME, GOD IN ME, GOD IN ME. All day long. GOD IN ME, GOD IN ME. Awesome thought. *(Pauses while he thinks about it)* Awesome thought. *(Pause)* Awesome thought.

Len: OH NO! Stuck words, stuck songs. HELP!

GY: Say youall, I just had an idea! Maybe when God is living in you good songs and thoughts get stuck in our brains.

Len: Hey, I never thought about THAT!

GY: Thinking times are good times for youall. Think about it: GOD IN ME. GOD IN ME.

Len: Do you think we can think "God in me" while we think about how to help me with my science project?

GY: Len now YOU have a stuck word! It is "THINK!"

(Len and GY laugh)

GY: So what science project do youall have? Let's have a look at it!

Len: Thanks, Grandpa Youall. I think you are the best!

God the Giver Puppet Show - Week 11-Salvation

Props: The two ornaments referred to are the ones that are in the Teacher's Manual to be used in Lesson 11 (Green Christmas trees.). Two are needed - one blank one and one decorated one. See instructions on how to decorate in Lesson 11. The trees should be mounted on pencils so all the children will easily be able to see. Len comes up carrying the blank green tree. The prepared tree will be used a little later.

Len comes up holding the blank tree.

Teacher: *(Comes up and notices the tree.)* Len, what have you got there?

Len: It's my Sunday School project. My teacher wants us to decorate it.

Teacher: Hey, I'll help. We can paint on some Santa Clauses and reindeer and candy canes and lights.

Len: No, Mrs. _____. It has to be decorated to tell the real meaning of Christmas. I don't think Santa Claus is the real meaning of Christmas.

Teacher: You're definitely right about that. Then what are you going to do?

Len: I don't know! That's my problem! I don't know how to show the real meaning of Christmas!

Teacher: Hmmmm! *(thinking)* I know who will know! Grandpa Youall! I'll ask him for a suggestion! *(Len goes down)*

(Teacher knocks on the door/stage/easel. Grandpa Youall comes up.)

GY: Well, hello, youall. What brings youall to my door today?

Teacher: Grandpa Youall, can you help Len? He's got to decorate this ornament with the real meaning of Christmas. Got any ideas?

GY: Yep! Salvation - there's your idea.

Teacher: Salvation????

GY: Salvation, that's God's gift to youall that began at Christmas. That's why we celebrate Christmas - to honor God's gift of salvation to us!

Teacher: You mean Jesus?

GY: That's right! Christmas, when Jesus was born, was the beginning of "God's gift of salvation" coming to earth. *(calls behind the stage to Len)* Len!!! Come on over. I think I can help youall.

GY disappears behind the stage. Noise is made (voices of GY and Len, etc.) to act like they are working on something. Len comes up. Len has the decorated tree this time.

Len: *(Calls to Grandpa Youall behind the stage.)* Thank you, Grandpa Youall. This is great! *(Shows decorated tree.)* Mrs. _____, can you see how this tree shows the real meaning of Christmas???

Teacher: I sure can, Len. What a good idea. I wonder if anyone else will be able to figure it out. Let's take it to Bible Club and show the kids! I wonder if they will "get" it?

Len: One thing's for sure!

Teacher: What's that?

Len: Thanks to Grandpa Youall, mine will be the best. If there is a prize, I'm sure I'll get it.

Teacher: A prize? Wouldn't that be great!

Len: *(walks off talking.)* My Sunday school teacher never said anything about a prize, but sometimes she surprises us. I bet I'll win. . . .

God the Giver Puppet Skit - Week 12-JESUS

Needed as props: two small, flat, gift -wrapped objects. For example - Two 3"x 3" pieces of stiff cardboard attached to Grandpa Youall's hand.

GY: *(Comes up with the two wrapped gifts)* Where are those two kids? I want to give them their Christmas gift.

(Lucy comes up)

Lucy: Merry Christmas, Grandpa Youall! What do you have there, Grandpa Youall?

GY: Why, it's a little Christmas gift for youall, from me. Isn't Len with you?

Lucy: No, he's practicing for the Christmas concert today. You bought us each a Christmas gift? But I didn't get anything for you!

GY: That's good, because at my age I have everything I need.

Lucy: What is it?

GY: Youall will have to guess. But I CAN give you three hints. It gives you commands. It can remind you of important Bible stories. And it is very colorful!

Lucy: It sounds like a computer! An ipod?

GY: Now hold on there . . . do you think I'm made of money?

(Lucy laughs)

Lucy: Whatever it is, it's special because it comes from you, Grandpa Youall!!

GY: Do youall remember the greatest gift of all?

Lucy: Well, those mittens I received from my aunt last year were pretty cool!
