

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 1

Love

We will use two lamb puppets, Wooly and Snowball, to help carry the “shepherd” theme throughout this unit. Len, Lucy and Grandpa Youall will also be used in the first part of this introductory skit. In the later skits only Len OR Lucy will be used with Grandpa Youall. You will have to switch between them and the lamb Puppets. For this puppet skit you will need to “mark” Wooly and Snowball’s ears ahead of time with a piece of brown paper or leather (stapled on). When Wooly and Snowball talk, some of their words will have extra “aaa”s in them. Pronounce them like a “Baaa” sheep sound but without the “B” sound. Example: Yeaah.

Narrator: Len, Lucy and Grandpa Youall are taking a trip! Grandpa Youall has invited Len and Lucy to go to the farm that he used to own before he moved to Len and Lucy’s neighborhood. They have just arrived at the farm. On the way Grandpa asked Len and Lucy to guess what animal he raised on the farm. They are trying to guess. Can you guess? (If kids don’t guess, tell them the answer is sheep.) What would you call someone who raised sheep or takes care of them? A shepherd.

(Grandpa Youall, Len, and Lucy come up.)

Len: Hey, this is a cool farm, Grandpa Youall! Where are all the sheep?

Lucy: Yeah, little lambs are so cute. I just want to hug them and kiss them!

GY: Wait a minute, you two. Most of the sheep are out in the pasture eating the good grass. We’ll go see them soon. I think the shepherd is “marking” them today.

Len: Marking the sheep? What’s that?

GY: The shepherd puts a little notch in the sheep’s ear or he attaches a clip to its ear. It’s to show that a sheep belongs to the shepherd. He marks a sheep to show he owns it. We’ll see them soon enough. But first let’s go inside the house and get some lunch. I’m hungry! (Len, Lucy and GY go down.)

(Wooly and Snowball appear and look around.)

Wooly: Aaaah, the coast is clear! No kids in sight! (Pause.) Did you hear them talking, Snowball? That’s why this clip is on my ear. I’ve been “marked” to show I belong here. You have been “marked,” too, Snowball.

Snowball: (Proudly) Yep, it’s our maaark to show we belong to Mr. Goodman. He is our shepherd now and I like him. Do you like him, Wooly?

Wooly: Yeaah, he’s a good shepherd. But you’re too young to remember when Grandpa Youall was our shepherd. He was a really good shepherd, too!

Snowball: Did he take good caaare of you?

Wooly: He sure did! He gave us everything. We didn’t go without anything we needed! We had good food and fresh water. He watched over us so no wild animals could get us. And he took caaare of us when we were sick.

Snowball: I’m glaaad we have good shepherds, Wooly. I wouldn’t know how to take care of myself if we didn’t! Hey, we’d better get baaack to the rest of the sheep and the shepherd.

Wooly: Yeaah, soon those two kids will come back from lunch. And if they find us - well, you know how little girls love to hug and kiss cute little lambs like you.

Snowball: Come on, let’s scraaam! (They run off.)

(Len and Lucy reappear.)

Lucy: I just can’t wait to see some cute little lambs! I wish Grandpa Youall would hurry up!

Len: This is going to be a cool farm trip, learning all about sheep and how a shepherd takes care of them. I think we are going to learn a lot!

Lucy: Here comes Grandpa Youall. It’s time to go see the sheep. Let’s go! (Len and Lucy leave.)

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 2

Peace

(Grandpa Youall, Len come up.)

Len: Thank you for taking us to the sheep farm, Grandpa Youall! This is the BEST farm trip!

GY: I am having fun too. I loved being a shepherd here.

Len: HEY LOOK! (Points to the right.) The sheep are all LEAVING! Where are they going?

GY: Mr. Goodman, the shepherd is leading them to new pastures.

Len: Let's follow them! (Puppets exit.)

(Wooly and Snowball enter from left, talking as they move slowly to center.)

Snowball: (Whining.) I'm tired, and my poor little feet hurt. It is so faaar, Wooly.

Wooly: I know it has been a long waaalk for you up these hills and dusty trails.

Snowball: I hope we will stop soon.

Wooly: Mr. Goodman is leading us to another paaasture, Snowball. Just keep following him.

Snowball (Looks towards audience.) Hey Wooly! What's wrong with thaaaaat spot?

Wooly: Too many thorns and thistles. You wouldn't waaant to eat there.

Snowball: Well, I aaaam hungry and thirsty too.

Wooly: I know.

Snowball: (Looks back.) Hey, there's a good place over there. See it has graaaas! (Starts to walk back.)

Wooly: You will get lost if you go your own way, come baaack and follow the shepherd.

Snowball: (Snowball comes back and looks to the far right.) I SEE IT! I SEE IT!

Wooly: (Looks in same direction.) Look at aaaall that beautiful green grass.

Snowball: We can eat and play and then lie down in that green pasture.

Wooly: It looks like there might even be a place where the waaater is quiet and still and we can drink.

Snowball: It's wonderful. How did Mr. Goodman find this place?

Wooly: He knew it was here aaall along.

Snowball: He did? We sure have a good shepherd, Wooly! I am glaaad I followed him! (Turns around.) Look! Those kids are behind us! I wonder if THEY have a shepherd? I wonder who leads them? (Puppets look at each other.)

Wooly: Too baaad we can't ask them. Let's get a drink and then lie down and take a rest. (Puppets exit.)

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 3
Restoration

(Lucy and Grandpa Youall walk up.)

Lucy: It looks like all the sheep are resting over there in the field.
Oh, no, look! Over there! (Looks in a direction or points.) One of the sheep is upside down!
It looks like it's in trouble! Now it's waving its legs in the air trying to get up!

GY: Oh, no! That sheep is **cast**!

Lucy: Cast? What's that?

GY: When a sheep has rolled onto its back and can't get up, it is cast. It is so helpless. See how it struggles and kicks? It just can't turn itself over so the shepherd has to do it.

Lucy: How does the sheep get that way in the first place?

GY: Well, a sheep can be cast because of too much fat or having extra heavy wool. Sometimes it happens just by accident. A sheep will roll over too far while resting in a little hollow in the ground and can't get up.

Lucy: Oh, that poor sheep. Let's hurry and go tell Mr. Goodman!

(Lucy and Grandpa Youall leave.)

(Wooly and Snowball appear.)

Wooly: Hey, thaaat was a close one!

Snowball: Wooly, what was the maaatter with you? Why were you on your baaack like that?

Wooly: I couldn't help it. I rolled over and couldn't get myself up. It's all this extra heavy wool on me that keeps me from being able to turn myself over.

Snowball: But something baaad could have happened to you.

Wooly: Well, nothing did. Grandpa Youall and those kids spotted me and told Mr. Goodman. He came right away and helped me up. Mr. Goodman restored me.

Snowball: He what?

Wooly: He restored me by picking me up and rubbing my legs until the feeling came baaack. Then he paaatted my head and sent me on my way. That's what restored means - making things right again!

Snowball: I'm glaaaad you're OK. (Pause.) You're my best friend

(Wooly and Snowball rub noses and then go down.)

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 4

Direction



You will need an offstage voice for a wolf growling and a gentle shepherd.
(Wooly and Snowball enter.)

Wooly: C'mon, Snowball. It's time to move. We've got to follow the shepherd to another pasture. He's caaalling us. I can hear his voice.

Snowball: But, Wooly, it's so good here. Why do we haaave to move?

Wooly: Because we have eaten up almost all the good grass around here. We have to go someplace where there is new grass. C'mon!

(Wooly turns to the right to go. Snowball follows Wooly for a step, then stops, and turns the other way. Wooly keeps on walking until he disappears. Snowball is alone.)

Snowball: (Defiantly.) I'm **not** ready to go yet. Let them all go. I'll just go this way and find my own little patch of grass! I'll be just fine. I can take caaare of myself. (Snowball munches for a while.) Mmmm, this is good grass.

(A soft growl is heard.)

Snowball: What's thaaat? (Growl is heard again, a little louder.) Oh, no. I'm in trouble now. Where's the shepherd? Where's Wooly? I've lost the other sheep. (Growl is very loud.) I'm in trouble. I'm in BIG trouble!

Gentle voice of the shepherd is heard off stage: Oh, there you are Snowball. You've wandered away. You wanted your own way. (Wooly appears.) Look, I've brought Wooly with me to comfort you. (Wooly comes near Snowball.) Snowball, you must learn to listen to my voice and follow me. I will lead you in the right path. There you will be safe. C'mon now, let's go join the others.

Wooly: I told you to come! Why didn't you?

Snowball: I just wanted to go my own way. But now I know that doesn't work. It was the shepherd who put me back on the right paath. I'll follow the shepherd from now on!

(Wooly and Snowball go down.)

(Lucy and Grandpa Youall appear.)

Lucy: Grandpa Youall, we've been on this farm a while and I haven't hugged a cute little lamb yet. When can I?

GY: I know, Lucy, but you'll just have to be patient. Right now the shepherd is taking the sheep to a new pasture. We'll follow them.

Len: Maybe a sheep will get lost and we can find it!

GY: Maybe, but the shepherd keeps a close eye out for sheep who wander off when they are moving.

Lucy: Well, just in case, I'm going to be watching out for a lost sheep! I can hardly wait to hug and kiss a cute little lamb.

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 5

Comfort



(Grandpa Youall and Lucy walk closely together towards the right)

Lucy: I think we ought to go back.

GY: Go back? This is an adventure! (pause) You're not scared are youall?

Lucy: (puts head down) Well, sort of. I didn't know we would go this far and have to walk between these mountains! It sure is dark and scary. I'm glad we have you, Grandpa Youall, around.

GY: This is one of the more frightening parts of the journey. Youall just watch that shepherd and follow along with the sheep. Don't worry, he will guide us. (Grandpa Youall, Lucy exit)

.....
(Wooly and Snowball come up. Snowball is snuggling close to Wooly as they walk along.)

Snowball: Oh, Wooly, I'm scaaaared.

Wooly: Don't be afraid, my little friend.

Snowball: But I've never been in a place like this before. It is so daark and scaaary.

Wooly: It is daaark and scaary, because this is the valley.

Snowball: (shaking) Oh-h-h, I've heard about the valley from the other sheep.

Wooly: The shadows from the mountains make it scaaary.

Snowball: And there are so many rocks and rough places. A wild animal could jump out and get me.

Wooly: (gently but firmly) Snowball, we have to do this even though none of us like to paass through the valley.

Snowball: Why do we have to go then?

Wooly: It's the way the shepherd leads us.

Snowball: But, I want to be up on the hillside where it is sunny.

Wooly: First we have to go through the valley. (pause) Actually the valley isn't all that baaad.

Snowball: What could be good about such a horrible place?

Wooly: Well, the very best grass is at the bottom of the valley and there's lots of it.

Snowball: Yeaahh?

Wooly: Uh, huh. And down in the valley are big streams and rivers with fresh water to drink!

Snowball: I'm still afraid. (looks right) What if there is a wolf or bear hiding behind those rocks over there? I've heard they like little lamb chops like me for dinner.

Wooly: The shepherd will use the rod in his hand to protect you.

Snowball: Will it work?

Wooly: I've seen him use that rod to chase away wolves, lions, bears, and even snakes!

Snowball: What if I lose my way in the valley?

Wooly: The shepherd will use the staff with the curve on the end to gently guide you.

Snowball: Whew, that's good to know. It is a COMFORT.

Wooly: You don't haave to be afraid of the valley when the shepherd is with you.

Snowball: (admiringly) You sure are brave, Wooly.

Wooly: I have been through the valley with the shepherd many times before.

Snowball: Then you're not afraid?

Wooly: (shakes head) No, I know he'll make it safe for me.

Snowball: I want to be as brave as you are.

Wooly: Just remember, the shepherd is aalways with you. (puppets exit)

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 6
What We Need



(Len comes up and acts like he is pulling weeds. Grandpa Youall comes up a moment later)

Len: Whew! This is hard work pulling weeds! Why do we have to pull these weeds anyway?

GY: Mr. Goodman, the shepherd, said these are poisonous weeds. If the sheep eat just a few of these weeds, they could DIE!

Len: Oh, that's right. But this is such HARD work!

GY: Youall are doing a fine job! I think you are almost finished. Now the sheep can graze safely in this area. All the bad weeds are out.

Len: The shepherd really cares for his sheep, doesn't he, Grandpa Youall? He knows all the dangers around them.

GY: That's right, Len. The shepherd knows there are poisonous weeds that grow in this pasture and he cares enough for the sheep to send us up ahead to pull them out. Why don't youall go back to the truck? I think there's a nice cold drink waiting for you.

Len: Yay!

(Len and GY leave and Wooly and Snowball appear)

Snowball: Look, Wooly, a whole new pasture of good green grass to eat! It looks like a great big TABLE.

Wooly: This is the tableland. We're up a bit higher on the mountain now. But waaatch out for the poisonous weeds!

Snowball: Why?

Wooly: Because if you eat them you will get very sick like this. (Wooly flips over so he is lying on his back.)

Snowball: Wooly, get up! What do these poisonous weeds look like?

Wooly: Let's see. (He begins looking around) I don't see any! They've all been pulled out. Our shepherd must have sent someone up here to get this table land ready for us sheep. He cares for us. He takes care of everything we need.

Snowball: Maybe he had those two kids do it; the ones who are always hanging around. I guess they are not so baaad after all.

Wooly: That little girl sure keeps her eyes on you, Snowball. I think she wants to make friends with you!

Snowball: Hmm...Maybe that wouldn't be so baaad either!

Wooly: C'mon, Snowball, I'll race you to that rock!

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 7

Healing



(You will need to put a small piece of red yarn on Snowball's ear to signify a cut by a thorn.)

Grandpa Youall and Lucy come up.

Lucy: (Sadly) I miss Len, Grandpa Youall.

GY: I miss him, too.

Lucy: (Speaks with disgust.) WHY did Len have to get the chicken pox while we are at the farm? Now he can't be with us and he is missing so much fun!

GY: I know. But youall don't want to get chicken pox so we must stay away from Len for a few days. I'm thankful it isn't serious.

Lucy: That's true. I guess we should be thankful that Jesus is healing him. (Looks to the left) Grandpa Youall, what is the matter with that little lamb?

(GY and Lucy peer to the left and then go down.)

(Wooly enters slowly from right as though nibbling grass as he walks. Snowball enters from the left as though hurt.)

Snowball: Oh, Wooly, a terrible thing has happened! I got caaaught in the briar bushes over there!

Wooly: That's too baaaad, Snowball. Where does it hurt?

Snowball: I cut my head and scratched myself all over. I thought that thorny bush would never let go of me.

Wooly: You have to stay away from those bushes.

Snowball: It hurt so baaad, Wooly!

Wooly: But the shepherd took good caaare of you, didn't he?

Snowball: The shepherd always takes good care of me!

Wooly: And he was gentle, right?

Snowball: So-o-o gentle. I thought he might scold me for getting myself into such a mess, but he didn't. Instead he carefully lifted me out of the bushes and held me in his arms.

Wooly: Uh - huh.

Snowball: He looked me over and gently pulled out the thorn. Then he took that little holder from his belt. Guess what's in it, Wooly?

Wooly: Oil.

Snowball: (Surprised.) How did you know?

Wooly: I've been with the shepherd a long time, remember?

Snowball: Oh, yeaah. (Pause.) The shepherd poured oil right on my head and it felt wonderful.

Wooly: The oil helps clean and heal your wounds.

Snowball: Guess what the shepherd did next?

Wooly: I suppose he made a cup out of his hands and scooped up water out of that stream over there and gave you a drink.

Snowball: That's exactly what he did. His hand was overflowing with water! (Looks at Wooly suspiciously.) Did you ever get caaaught in the briar bushes, Wooly?

Wooly: I sure have, and the shepherd always made me feel better.

Snowball: (Turns slightly and gets excited.) Look! Curly is headed straight for the briar bushes!

Wooly: (Looks in the same direction.) Oh, no!

Snowball: Let's go waaarn him to stay away. (Both exit to the right, shouting as they go.) Watch out, Curly! Stay away from those bushes!

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit – Week 8
A Home In Heaven

(Lucy comes up first and yells to Len)

Lucy: LEN . . . LEN. COME HERE. LOOK, THE SHEEP ARE COMING BACK. *(Len comes up)*

Len: *(Len and Lucy look to the left.)* I see them. *(Looks at Lucy)* You probably scared them too.

Lucy: Len, I missed you. I am glad you are all better now. *(Gives Len a hug)* I have an idea. You can help me chase one of those little lambs. After we catch it, you can take my picture while I give the cute little lamb a hug.

Len: Not now, Lucy. Grandpa Youall says we are going to take the truck and ride out to the sheep so we can see them and Mr. Goodman.

Lucy: Cool! Let's go! *(Puppets exit)*

(Wooly and Snowball come up)

Snowball: *(Dreamily)* And he led us to that beaaaautiful pasture with the cool water.

Wooly: And we were restored.

Snowball: The thing that really scared me was going through the daaark valley.

Wooly: We haaad to go through it to get to the other side.

Snowball: *(Shaking all over)* Just thinking about all those huge rocks and daaark shadows scares me.

Wooly: But our shepherd was always there to protect us. And now we are almost home.

Snowball: We are?

Wooly: Yes. But Snowball, you are not the same little lamb you were when we first started out.

Snowball: Nope, I'm growing up like you, Wooly!

Wooly: We sure learned a lot on thaaat long journey. Tell me something you learned about our shepherd.

Snowball: I remember how gently took care of me when I got caught in the bushes. I was hurt and so he put oil on my cuts. I know he loves me and cares for me.

Wooly: He loves aaall of us, Snowball. Our shepherd will show us goodness and love every step of the way when we trust him.

Snowball: *(Pause)* Wooly, those kids are here! That boy is baaack again. Where has he been?

Wooly: I don't know. Too baaad those kids don't have a shepherd.

Snowball: Maybe that Grandpa is their shepherd.

Wooly: Could be.

Snowball: *(Excitedly)* Wooly, look there is the sheepfold. We're almost home! I want to stay there forever!

Wooly: *(Laughs)* Just trust the shepherd, he will lead you little one.

Snowball: Help me Wooly! Here comes that little girl! Let's get out of here! *(Runs to other side and exits. Wooly follows.)*

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 9
Jesus, Our Good Shepherd



This puppet show is a little different so read it over first.

(Grandpa Youall, and Lucy appear)

GY: Well, Lucy, our trip to the sheep farm is almost over. I wonder if you can tell me one thing youall have learned?

Lucy: I learned that the shepherd takes really good care of his sheep! And I learned that the sheep need to follow the shepherd or they can get in REALLY BIG trouble!

GY: Very good. Youall learned a lot about shepherds and sheep.

Lucy: And I know something else! I know that I am like a little lamb and Jesus is MY Good Shepherd!

GY: Great! I'm so pleased with what you have learned. Now let's go pack up our things for the trip home.

(Grandpa Youall leaves. Lucy stays behind and looks to the left.)

Lucy: But, but . . . I never got to hold a cute little lamb. *(She starts to cry)*

(Snowball slowly comes up on the right and goes behind Lucy and starts to nuzzle under her arm)

Lucy: Wha, wha, what's that?!! *(Turns around)* Oh, it's a little lamb! Hello there, how are you? Don't be afraid, I won't hurt you. *(Snowball lets Lucy hug her)*

Lucy: You know, little lamb, we are a lot alike. You are a little lamb and have Mr. Goodman for a shepherd. I'm like a lamb, too, only you can't see my shepherd. But I know my shepherd is with me. His name is Jesus and He lives up in heaven, but he still can take care of me. Sometimes I'm afraid, or lonely, or sad. Sometimes I get into trouble, but my shepherd knows all about it. Jesus, my shepherd, will always love me and I want to follow him. You understand, don't you, little lamb?

Voice of Grandpa Youall offstage: C'mon, Lucy, it's time to go now!

Lucy: Bye-bye little lamb. Thanks for being my friend. Here's a hug and a kiss for you. *(Lucy gives Snowball a hug and a kiss.)*

(Lucy disappears. Snowball stays. Wooly appears.)

Wooly: Snowball! What haaappened? Did that little girl hug and kiss you?

Snowball: Yeaaaah, she was crying so I went up to her. She was so nice to me. She talked about her shepherd.

His name is Jesus. He's a good shepherd, too.

Wooly: I've heard about Jesus, He's the GREAT SHEPHERD!

Snowball: Wooly, now that we are home, whaaat are we going to do?

Wooly: I don't know Snowball, but remember, we must aaalways follow the shepherd!

Snowball: *(Thoughtfully)* Yeaaaah, aaalways follow the shepherd.

The Lord is My Shepherd, Puppet Skit - Week 10



Jesus, Our King and Reminders

Have the focus verse visible on the flannelgraph board. (Len and Lucy come up)

Lucy: Hey, Len, did you learn the memory verse from Bible Club today?

Len: Not all of it. Did you?

Lucy: No, not really. I tried to learn it but I can't remember it! I always have that problem!

Len: Let me see if I can remember some of it. "We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way." Hey, it rhymes!

Lucy: Let me try it! "We all like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way."

Len: We could do it like a rap! *(Put some bouncing rhythm into it)* "We all like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way."

Lucy: That's cool! But look, what about the rest of the verse. *(Lucy looks at the verse on the flannelgraph board)* "And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." What does that mean? Hey, is that my mom calling me? What did I forget to do this time? Gotta run, Len. *(Lucy goes down)*

Len: OK. I think I'll ask Grandpa Youall about the verse. I'll catch up with you later.

Len: Grandpa Youall! Grandpa Youall!

GY: Oh, hello youall. What's going on?

Len: I need some help understanding this verse. Listen. "We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

GY: Well, do you remember when we went to the sheep farm and sometimes the sheep would wander and go their own way? People do that too! When we want our own way and choose not to follow God's way it is called sin and sin is another word for iniquity. Everyone is guilty of that! You, me, the WHOLE WORLD is guilty of sinning against God.

Len: Then how do we get rid of this sin?

GY: When it says, "The Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all," the verse is talking about Jesus dying on the cross. God hates sin so much. No one with sin in them can be near Him. God made a way for this sin to be paid for because of his great love for us.

Len: How?

GY: God put all our sins on Jesus. He took the punishment for our sins by dying on the cross.

Len: Wow! What a great thing! I love this verse! It will always remind me of what Jesus did!

GY: And don't youall forget where to find it in the Bible! Isaiah 53:6!

Len: Right! Now I know the Bible verse from Bible Club. I'm going to explain it to my friends too!

Len: *(Leaves saying the verse in a rap)* "We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." Isaiah 53:6!

Forgiveness and Life

Lucy: I'm glad you could pick me up from school today and take me to McDonald's. I've never been to McDonald's with you before. I wish Len could have come, too. But he had football practice today.

GY: I miss Len too but I enjoy coming here with youall. It's lonely going to McDonald's all by myself.

Lucy: I wonder if Mr. Goodman, Snowball and Woolly's shepherd, ever gets lonely. He probably never gets to go to McDonald's. Do you think he ever gets tired of taking care of those sheep? He is with them every minute.

GY: Mr. Goodman is a very dedicated shepherd. He loves those sheep so much that he always wants to be near them.

Lucy: Would he stay with the sheep if something scary happened, like a tornado, a bomb or a war?

GY: Yes, Lucy. A good shepherd would give his life to protect his sheep.

Lucy: Just like Jesus, our Good Shepherd, gave His life for us.

GY: That's right, Lucy.

Lucy: That's such a sad story - when Jesus gave up his life for us on the cross. It makes me cry sometimes.

GY: That's alright, Lucy. I'm glad youall feel such love for Jesus. He died willingly for everyone who believes that Jesus died to pay for his or her sins. But then God raised Him from the dead, defeating sin and death and if we believe in Jesus it makes it possible for us to be restored to God and live in heaven someday with him forever. We can never thank Him enough.

Lucy: I'm so glad Jesus is my Shepherd and Savior. Hey, I've got an idea. Let's buy a meal for Mr. Goodman and deliver it out to the sheep farm.
